## The Challenges.

- Fall Season ends mid November possibly first week of December
- Spring sports start March 1.
- Avg temps high 37 / Low 27 Soil temp average 39

#### A Possible Solution.

# An old idea with new potential. Painting or Dying our fields. The Potential Questions. Can we increase recovery during harsh growing conditions? Is limiting the hardening off process beneficial? How does the turf bounce out of dormancy?

#### The Research

- Winter of 2021 we started a trial looking at the benefits of turf paint.
- We used two products Civitas and TS Pro Green Shield
  - First application was done December 2, 2021
  - Second Application was applied to select fields March 3, 2022
- Application rates
  - Civitas 2.5gal/acre and 5gal/acre
  - TS Pro Green Shield 4oz/1000sq ft and 8oz/1000sq ft


















































## The Turn

 March 1, 2022 we start to see some very interesting results






















# The Turn Part II

- Game fields were sprayed with Civitas at 5g/100g H2o rate on December 3, 2021
- March 2, 2022 sprayed TS Pro Green Shield at 2.5gal/100g H2o on all game fields.


- Increased applications & additional products?

### Turf Paint For Warm Season Varieties






































#### What worked best

- Dual Fan Nozzle
- TeeJet nozzles TTJ60-11006VP
- 40 psi
- 120 gallons water sprayed at 1.5 gal/1000
- 10 gallons split
- 240 gallons water with 10 gallon of paint did not work well too diluted.
